## REDEMPTION TO REVELATION TO RE...

For over 400 years, the Israelites were slaves in Egypt. But then, with God by his side, Moses uttered those famous words, "Let my people go," and everything changed. A people who had been oppressed, who had been demoralized, who had lost their sense of self, were now free. They were brought out of Egypt and their journey — physical, emotional, spiritual —

began. With God guiding them in the desert, they made their way to Mt. Sinai, and it was here that all of *B'nai Yisrael* — every single one of us! — received Torah.

Redemption led to Revelation. But what did Revelation lead to? Summer vacation?

Things always seem to slow down a bit during the summer. The kids are at camp. Meetings and conference calls are a bit less frequent. Emails bounce back with that automatic Out-of-Office response. The "dog days" of summer give everyone a chance to ease off of the frenetic pace of the rest of the year.

The same can be said for the Jewish calendar.

Shavuot, the third of our *shalosh regalim*, the three Biblical Pilgrimage festivals, has come and gone. The Israelites have experienced Revelation at Mt. Sinai and are en route to *Eretz Yisrael*, the Land of Israel. The Jewish calendar can finally take a deep breath, mix up a refreshing fruity drink, find a nice book and a comfy beach chair, and just relax.

And it makes sense doesn't it? We have always used the summer as a time to catch our breath. Whether it's going on a much-needed vacation, taking some tennis or golf lessons, or even cleaning out the garage, our summers are the perfect time to recharge.

Our tradition's calendar does the same. After all, it knows

what's coming...the High Holy Days...so the calendar needs some time to relax and unwind. The summer months of the Jewish calendar, *Tammuz*, *Av* and *Elul*, do just that. Of course it is important to remember that many tragic events have befallen the Jewish people during these months, and in many ways, these months are seen as an extended time of mourning. In fact, the ninth day of *Av* (*Tisha B'Av*) is considered to be the second most solemn day of the year next to Yom Kippur.

But in spite of the mourning — or perhaps because of it — these months are committed to reflection and rejuvenation. The first of *Tammuz* is the anniversary of the birth of Joseph, son of Jacob. As we know, Joseph was thrown into a pit by his brothers and eventually "went down" to Egypt. But in the end, it was Joseph who saved his family from famine. Joseph reminds us that the month of *Tammuz* is a time of rebirth. The first of *Av* is the anniversary of the death of Aaron. Rabbinic legend has it that Aaron had the perfect death. His entire family is by his side, and his brother, Moses, comforts him as his soul passes from his body. On the new moon of *Av*, we honor the mystery of death, and we recommit to the task of the living: to be a disciple of Aaron, a lover and pursuer of peace. And of course the month *Elul* is entirely devoted to reflection and rejuvenation. Jews are asked to take this month and turn inward. Just as we need time to prepare ourselves and gear up for the year ahead, so too, does the Jewish calendar give us an opportunity to do the same.

So how will you spend your time this summer? I certainly hope you have a chance to relax. To get away. To take some time for yourself. But I also hope you'll take the opportunities the summer gives you to hit the refresh button. To reconnect with your family and friends. To recommit to what is important in your lives. As for the Reimers, we'll be reintroduced to the parenting of a newborn, as we get to know our new daughter Dahlia. I wish you and your family a safe, relaxing, refreshing, and rejuvenating summer.

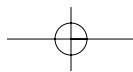

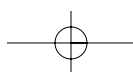
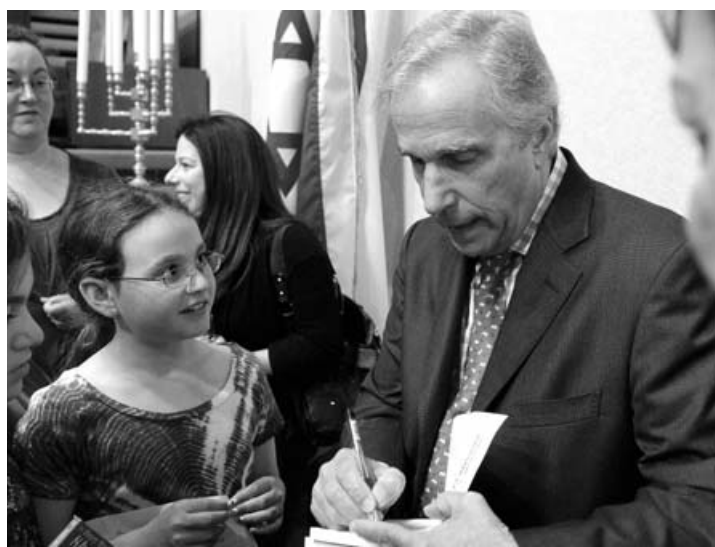

## Educate Each Child According To His Or Her Own Way.

This statement is intrinsic to the philosophy of education here at TBJ: Our children are not simple cookie dough to be cut from a die. Rather, each child brings to our synagogue family uniqueness. We should celebrate our children's individuality and abilities of all levels.

While the summer months bring us a break from our formal education programs, plans for next year keep us busily preparing for the success of our learners in the school year to come. These plans cause us to reflect on the year that has passed and look forward with great enthusiasm. Thinking back to April, we participated in Autism Awareness month and gained knowledge of the wide spectrum of able people with Autism. We were also reminded by Henry Winkler and Marlee Matlin, our Cooperman Family Distinguished Speakers, of the challenges facing people with disabilities. For so many of our families, there is the fear of the unknown, and worse, the fear of what might become known. We hide from our differences instead of embracing them. We are blinded by the challenges that, if nurtured, might become our strengths. There is genius in each of us. The door need only be unlocked, and the key to unlocking this genius is honest conversation.

From the perspective of our education professionals, this means more than providing for individual learning needs. It means that we as a community are obligated to not only understand the children whom we educate, but are also obligated to care for each soul within our walls. Every member of this TBJ family is responsible for one another. With that responsibility comes the need for genuine understanding. Different is not *better* or *less than*, it is simply different, and each of us has a different way of living in our world. Our challenge is in remembering that fact throughout our personal interactions. How do you treat someone who acts differently? How do you respond to someone who looks different? How many conversations are had about "you know who," simply because he is different? Are any of us really the "same?"

This biblical verse teaches us:

(If you) educate a child according to his (or her) own way, even as an adult, he (or she) will not turn from it.

*Proverbs 22:6*

Our vision of education goes beyond the walls of our classrooms and even beyond the walls of our schools. ## TODD ABRAMS SPENT TWO WEEKS IN HAITI

This April, our member Todd Abrams spent two weeks in Haiti as a volunteer at a hospital at the Port Au Prince airport set up to aid victims of the earthquake and to provide medical care in the area. Todd has been a volunteer EMT in Millburn for the past 11 years and is in Haiti with Project Medishare for Haiti, an organization working there since 1994 to help improve the health conditions of the people in Haiti. Here are some of Todd's first-hand impressions, taken from the blog he shared with friends and family.

*Wow! What a day!!!! Conditions are way worse here than I imagined! Working hard. A lady here said she goes to all of the disasters in the world and she never saw such devastation like this. We just ran out of fuel so we had to shut down the ER for an hour.*

*It's sooooooooooooooooooooo hot here. 113 degrees again today with no breeze, I can't imagine what it is like in the summer! No A/C in the tents, not even in the ER. I'm sleeping on a tiny cot in the middle of a huge tent. I have a mosquito net because of the widespread malaria problems. The premies need to be taken out of their environment and held in front of the fan to cool them down.*

*Patients are usually begging us not to release them because they have nowhere to go and no money to buy food. Here they get two nutritious meals a day and free medical care. A very late stage pregnant woman came in today. Her doctor refused to deliver her baby earlier today because she had no money to pay him. We barely got her into the OR and delivered her baby.*

*The patients are allowed one family member to stay with the patient in the hospital. Luckily, they take care of changing their diapers, bedpan, etc. It's a huge win/win for them as well because they get free meals and shelter. They plead with me to get them cardboard so they can sleep on that instead of the dirt next to the patient's cot. Haiti was the poorest country in the Western Hemisphere before this cataclysm. In the tent cities, there is no electricity, running water or waste disposal system.*

*I worked in wound care — taking out pins from broken femurs from 1/12/10. Lots of people with horrific bed sores. Spent the rest of the day in the OR handing the surgeons scalpels, tools, gauzes, etc.*

*By the end of this week I'll have done more than I have done in my 11 years of being an EMT in Millburn.*

Todd will be addressing the Congregation at Shabbat Services on Friday, July 30<sup>th</sup>. Join us to hear more about his two weeks of service to the people of Haiti.

- Have your vision checked regularly

In addition to Healthy Aging, the quality of life as you age is also influenced by social relationships. A strong social network has been proven to have a major positive effect on retirees' enjoyment of life. Take care of yourself, spend time with others and enjoy the summer.

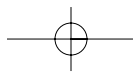

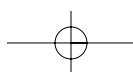

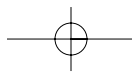
