THE FUNCTION OF MEMORY

What's so important about memory? How is it that a simple memory can make us laugh? Make us cry? And why does memory play such an enormous role in our tradition? I believe the answer is threefold:

TO PRESERVE

One function of memory is to preserve. Preserving family memories is an essential way to remember who we are. Telling stories, passing down family memorabilia, saving pictures allows us to not only

remember family members who we personally knew but to also remember family members that came long before us.

I've heard the various stories of my family countless times, but each time I hear those stories I am reminded that my family's collective history is my personal history as well. Family memory helps strengthen individual memory.

TO UNITE

A second function of memory is to unite a common people. Our Jewish calendar acknowledges three *Yoms*, three days, which are all meant to evoke communal memory: *Yom HaShoah* (Holocaust Remembrance Day) and *Yom HaZikaron* (Israel's Day of Remembrance) are the first two. In Israel, for a 24-hour period, on both *Yom Hashoah* and *Yom Hazikaron*, all places of public entertainment are closed. Every theater, every restaurant, every shop is closed. And on each of the two days, at exactly 11:00 am, sirens blast throughout the country, and the entire nation observes a two-minute cessation of all activity. People stop whatever they are doing and stand in silence. Offices filled with activity cease. Classrooms in the middle of a math or science lesson pause. Traffic stops on every street – even on the busiest of highways – and people stand by their cars. For two minutes the entire country is doing the exact same thing: Remembering.

The culmination of these Days of Remembrance is *Yom Ha'atzmaut*, Israeli Independence Day. Fireworks, dancing in the streets and barbeques take place all throughout the country to mark the day that Zionism's dream of an Israeli state was realized. Israelis, and Jews throughout the world, unite to celebrate the spiritual and physical rebirth of the Jewish homeland.

And right now our tradition is fulfilling a third function of memory.

Our calendar is currently in a period called *S'firat ha Omer*, the Counting of the Omer. It is a 49-day process that begins on the second night of Passover and ends on Shavuot. The counting of the *omer* is the act of remembering in its simplest form: We remember time itself. But why?

TO SEE THE DIVINE

In Genesis, we learn that God established time so that every moment follows another. Every moment has been given to us as a gift so that we use it for something meaningful, because God created everything for a purpose. Even memory – especially memory – has a purpose.

The counting of the *omer* marks time, and that time leads us to revelation! Each year I partake in one of the ritual observances of the *omer*, and I do not shave during the period of the *omer*.

Every time I look in the mirror, every time I put my hand to my face, every time my beard gets a little itchy **I remember...** personal memories, family memories, communal memories, sacred memories.

Our memories serve different purposes. They help connect us to our families. They give us stories to help us be us. Memory also connects us to our nation, to our people, to God. But in our tradition, even this is not enough. We remember in order **TO ACT**.

Just a few weeks ago we recalled our ancestors' redemption out of Egypt. *Avadim hayinu...* **We** were slaves... Our children were slaves, our children's children, and so on, were all slaves in Egypt. Our ancestors' memories are our memories. But we were also required to remember something else: Our potential. "Next year in Jerusalem" turns remembrance of the past into a tool for ensuring the future. It is an ideal giving us all a sense of hope and possibility.

But the potential for hope and possibility is not automatic. They are only realized if we are inspired to act. **Sunday, May 22nd** was our congregation's Family Mitzvah Day. Hundreds of us cooked meals for Tony's Soup Kitchen, helped decorate dog biscuit jars for the New Jersey Animal Shelter, or volunteered to walk the "Mitzvah Mile." There were over 50 opportunities to act on this great day.

So what do your memories give you? Do they allow you to remember your personal and family stories? Do they help connect you to your community? Your traditions? Do they serve as a reminder to reach out? Our memories – individual, family and communal – help make us who we are.

EDUCATION

While Memorial Day marks the unofficial start of summer, this month we'll officially welcome the season with barbecues, travel, family fun in the sun, and plenty of graduation parties. One of the Lee Family summer favorites includes a vacation from the kitchen to grill in our back yard. To fully enjoy the beautiful outdoors, we need to clean up the garden a bit, so I dove into my research and asked my "green guru," Jennifer Duckworth, what I should know to make the chore more sustainable and easy to upkeep. I had no idea what I'd learn next or how it would bring me back to a basic Jewish value.

My first lesson in green gardening came in the form of a brochure from the New Jersey Invasive Species Strike Team, which was established in response to the rapid onslaught of invasive plant species which will cause significant ecological damage to our forests.

Invasive species are non-native living organisms which invade and establish populations in new areas resulting in uncontrolled growth. An estimated 50,000 non-native plant and animal species are imported into the US each year, as part of international commerce or sport. While we rely on these plants for food, construction and ornamental gardening, the outcome is a serious economic problem, and invasive species are now considered the greatest threat to biodiversity. New Jersey is now home to 185 invasive plant species. Take a look at some of the most beautifully manicured gardens in our area and you'll likely be looking at one or more emerging invasive species.

Jen then handed me the NJISST "do not plant" list, deputized me in this new mission, and off to the garden store I went. Shopping list (rather non-shopping list) in hand, I felt

empowered and ready to get our summer off to a great start, while contributing in one small way to a greener NJ. Then, I began thinking about this seemingly infinite list and wondered how it came to be that so many "natural" beauties could become ecologically damaging to our area. I always found living in "The Garden State" to be a source of pride – after all, we've got Jersey Fresh summer vegetables, great camping and outdoor adventures. Growing up here I enjoyed summer drives "down the shore", just as hundreds of thousands of tourists will do en route to our beaches and summer amusement destinations. How then can we consider NJ's legendary flora "invasive?"

I thought about how I much I love my garden and the way it makes me feel as we sit outside and enjoy each other and the warm weather. I'd miss some of those beautiful plants, but then I remembered a Jewish tale that helped but things back into perspective. Once, while the sage, Honi, was walking along a road, he saw an old man planting a carob tree. Honi asked him: "How many years will it take for this tree to give forth its fruit?" The man answered that it would require 70 years. Honi asked: "Are you so healthy a man that you expect to live that length of time and eat its fruit?" The man answered: "I found a fruitful world because my ancestors planted it for me. So, too, will I plant for my children." (Babylonian Talmud, Ta'anit 23a)

The Eternal God took the man (Adam) and placed him in the Garden of Eden, to keep it and to watch over it. (Genesis 2:15). This summer, may we all pledge to do our part to watch over and keep our Garden State green, healthy and ready to meet the next generation.

CARING COMMUNITY

As one of the co-chairs of the Caring Community Committee, I have had the opportunity to get to know a very special member of our congregation. Marsha Kreuzman is recovering from a serious illness which left her in the hospital for months. Marsha is also a Holocaust survivor. I know so many of you have had the honor and privilege of knowing Marsha for years and hearing her story of survival. I have not had the opportunity, until now to get to know her. I am the lucky one right now who gets to spend time with her and know her. Every 2 months, I am faced with the task of writing a small entry for Tidings, representing the Caring Community Committee. When I asked Marsha if it was alright with her that she be the subject of my next article, she said in her very special accent, "why not".

Marsha is not just a Holocaust survivor. The doctors say she is a miracle because she was so sick. In my opinion, Marsha still has so much to teach. She tells me stories of the Holocaust as if she is telling me about her week. We all know what happened in the war. We all know how many Jewish lives were lost. I have come to learn about her brother who had diabetes and how she needed to steal insulin for his survival. She tells me how she was brutally punished repeatedly for these acts. I learned how she was dirty for five years because she was afraid to go to the showers for fear of what else could happen in those showers. Many times, she felt she could not go on and live through this torture, moving through five concentration camps and one ghetto from 13-18 years old. She also speaks of her husband, Robert whom she lost five years ago, who she still

yells at. But now she says, "he doesn't answer". She likes to be home because this is where she feels he is with her. Robert died in May. It is also a very significant month because May 18th is her birthday. She will be 87. May 5th was the day she was liberated from Mathausen. May, is also the month when we remember the Holocaust.

My conversations with Marsha are not all sad and grim. She is very funny and I find myself laughing many times in a conversation with her. In the short time that I have known her, she has given me so much. Yet she asks for nothing. She continues to speak to groups and recounts the Holocaust because she is here and the doctors told her to do what she has been doing for years. Although I have been reaching out to her to see how I can help in the transitional time back home, it is she who gives to me. She reminds me to never forget as she tells me the story of how she survived the Holocaust for 5 long years. As a member of the Caring Community Committee this is what we get to do. We get to be around what I believe is greatness. In this case, a woman who has lived a very long and meaningful life, who, without any anger tells me where she has been and what has made her who she is. I cannot quantify what I have received from Marsha, just that I am the one who receives.

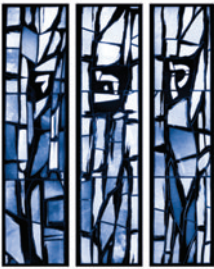
